Classical Music Month is an Official Resolution of the United States Congress, designating the month of September in the year 1994. The sponsors include the Classical Music Coalition and National Association of Recording Merchandisers. Jazz and National Piano Month are now synonymous. The Music Educators National Conference demonstrates that music has been integral in the U.S. school curriculum since 1838. Children play instruments during Show and Tell, while teachers plan the celebration of Johann Sebastian Bach and Franz Joseph Haydn birthdays. "Music for Life Week" each July reminds us that music soothes, heals, nurtures, and inspires.
